

Brief Overview of LEA Indicator 14 Data and Reports

Below are the outcomes data and reports you can view and edit for your district. These are available in October following the June through September survey window.

- **LEA Data**

This section provides the ability to select different criteria and/or demographics so LEAs have the ability to sort and view data in a variety of ways. Indicator 14 PSO data are sortable by the demographics of gender, race, disability, exit reason, building and school year.

1. **Demographics Table** – Table shows leavers eligible to participate in the survey (Population), and those who responded (Respondents), and is sortable by Building and Survey year.
2. **Survey Responses Data Sorts** – Displays every survey question, response choice and open-ended questions, is sortable by Building, Survey year and Demographics.
3. **Indicator 14 Data Sorts** – Displays Indicator 14 **data collection areas** and is sortable by Building, Survey year and Demographics.
4. **Indicator 14 ABC Data Sorts** – Displays Indicator 14 **reporting categories** and is sortable by Building, Survey year and Demographics.
5. **Longitudinal Report** – Displays survey questions and results for multiple years and is sortable by Building and Survey year.

- **LEA Reports**

These reports use LEA Outcomes Data to generate auto-filled reports that are ready to print or edit as desired.

1. **Summary Report** – Two page report. The results of the survey are organized around three areas of interest. The first part of this report includes a "duplicated" count of participation, meaning all the activities in which respondents are participating are counted, so percentages may add up to more than 100%. The chart at the end of the report is an "unduplicated" count, meaning the respondents are counted only once and in the highest category of participation. Measures A, Band C represent the data the district reports as their LEA Indicator 14 Post School Outcomes.
2. **Full Report**– Five plus pages. Provides every survey question and response choice percentage, tables of postsecondary education and employment demographics, and all the responses to open-ended questions.
3. **Indicator 14 Report** – One page report. The data below are based on an unduplicated count of successfully completed interviews, meaning respondents are counted in only one category, and in the highest category listed below. The sections in blue represent the state and LEA Indicator 14 reporting categories.
4. **Data Use Toolkit (DUT)** – Personalized PowerPoint developed by the National Post School Outcomes Center (now part of [NTACT](#)) that auto- **your LEA's outcomes data** for Transition Stakeholders in your LEA to review. It includes **graphs with LEA data**, state data and state targets for Indicator 14, and provides are questions for the team to consider, and a view of major outcomes by demographics to easily determine if outcomes for some leavers is not as good as for other leavers.
